01 THE ABORTION INDUSTRY IS ON THE RADICAL FRINGE OF PUBLIC OPINION

Planned Parenthood calls pro-lifers "extremists." But in reality, it's the abortion industry that's out of step with mainstream public opinion. A recent Marist Poll reported that:

- Only 12 percent of Americans agree with Planned Parenthood that abortion should be available all nine months of pregnancy.
- More than three quarters of Americans (including 60 percent of those who call themselves "pro-choice") want to ban abortion after the first trimester.
- One in four Democrats self-identifies as "pro-life."

The 2015 undercover investigation revealing that Planned Parenthood sold aborted baby body parts to medical research companies sent shockwaves through the abortion industry and led to further investigations from both Congress and the Department of Justice. But the sale of body parts harvested from aborted babies is not a recent development.

A 2000 episode of ABC's 20/20 exposed the same practice—right down to abortion workers altering abortion techniques and manipulating women into signing consent forms in order to procure organs. A 1999 flyer distributed by a fetal body part wholesaler advertised fetal brains available for \$999, spinal cords for \$325, and eyes for \$75.60.

The public debate over abortion is all-too-often clouded in euphemisms crafted to obscure the fact that abortion kills a living child. That's why many post-abortive women report falling for the lie that their baby was merely a "blob of tissue" or "clump of cells." But, as experts in medicine, the folks performing abortions can't use that excuse. Some of them don't even try:

- On a local television news broadcast, Texas and New Mexico abortionist Curtis Boyd told a reporter, "Am I killing? Yes, I am. I know that."
- In an undercover video released by the Center for Medical Progress, abortion provider Lisa Harris told participants at a Planned Parenthood workshop, "Let's just [concede that abortion is] violence; it's a person; it's killing; let's just give them all that."
- Harris described the abortion procedure as "violent" and said abortionists and pro-lifers view pre-born children "the same way."
- Joan Wright, owner of an abortion center in Ontario, told a reporter, "Good grief! They accuse us of pretending we're not doing what we're doing? I'm in the business of death!"

04 ABORTION IS THE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH, BOTH IN THE WORLD & IN THE U.S.

Globally, approximately 56 million lives are lost to abortion each year. About the same number of lives are lost worldwide annually to all other causes of death.

While significant progress has been made in the pro-life movement, abortion is still the leading cause of death in the United States—taking the lives of nearly one million children every year.

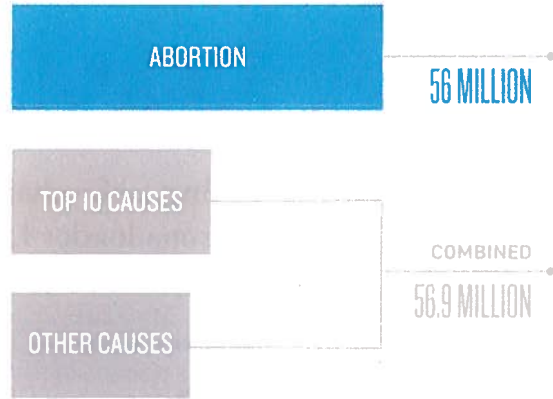
05 WHEN ABORTIONISTS GET IN TROUBLE, SOME PRACTICE IN ANOTHER STATE.

Bruce Norman performed abortions at the New Woman All Women Health Clinic in Birmingham, Alabama, where he oversaw numerous medical emergencies. He once proceeded with an abortion on a teenager who said she was being forced to have an abortion she didn't want and who reported the abortion would cause her psychological problems. In 2012, a state investigation revealed 76 pages of violations. The facility was forced to surrender its license, but Norman continued to perform abortions in Mississippi.

In 2009, Dr. Pierre Renelique was involved in a botched abortion where the baby was born alive, killed, and hidden in the abortion facility. It took police three searches to find the child's body. Renelique moved to New York, which declined to suspend his medical license after assessing him as "a physician who provides excellent medical care to an inner city poor population." Within a few years, he had settled three malpractice cases in New York.

Steven Brigham is, perhaps, the most notorious circuit-riding abortion provider, having seen his medical license suspended and revoked in numerous states.

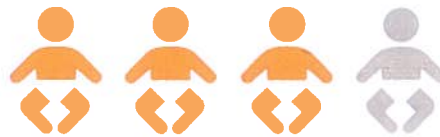
CAUSES OF DEATH WORLDWIDE
