In light of the growing concern about the coronavirus (COVID-19) and out of an abundance of caution, Bishop Knestout is instructing all parishes, schools, residential adult care centers, and campus ministries to take the following measures in their communities for the foreseeable future:

- Cease distribution of the Precious Blood (Christ is fully present under both species of the Blessed Sacrament.)
- Refrain from shaking hands during the Sign of Peace (bow or verbal gesture is appropriate).
- Refrain from holding hands during the Lord's Prayer.
- Remove Holy Water from the Baptismal and Holy Water fonts. (Continued on next column...)

Until further notice, Bishop Knestout has granted a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days to those 60 years of age or older; those with chronic illness; and those with immune system deficiencies. The dispensation is also extended to caregivers of people in the three groups indicated. While nothing can replace attendance at Mass and receiving Holy Communion, those already dispensed because of illness or (in addition) for the reasons given above have not committed a mortal sin. Those who refrain from attending Mass should, if possible, devote an hour to prayer on Sunday, observe Mass on television or on-line, or by praying the Rosary of some of the *Liturgy of the Hours*. Keeping the Lord's Day holy in these ways demonstrates a genuine desire for holiness and a sincerity of heart.

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

- “Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that are common in many different species of animals, including camels, cattle, cats, and bats. Rarely, animal coronaviruses can infect people and then spread between people such as with MERS, SARS, and now with 2019-nCoV” (Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), January 31, 2020). Also called COVID-19.
- You would more likely get the Coronavirus at Food Lion or Kroger than at church.
- You are at greater risk for the Coronavirus if you have heart disease, diabetes, lung problems, or are immune-compromised (CDC, March 10, 2020).
- What the best prevention is 20 seconds of handwashing. (Sing Happy Birthday 2 times, while washing your hands). This includes lathering your hands with soap and water, cleaning between your fingers, your nails, and the back of your hands.
- “Alcohol-based hand sanitizers, which should be rubbed in for about 20 seconds, can also work, but the gel must contain at least 60% alcohol” (New York Times, 2020).
- Due to the Coronavirus, withhold sharing of the peace, communal cup, and avoid hugging.
- “Staying home from work, school, and all activities when you are sick with Covid 19 symptoms, which may include fever, cough, and difficulty breathing” (CDC, March 1, 2020)
- Don’t touch your unclean hands to your face, nose, mouth or lips.
- Try to stay 6 to 10 feet away from people that are coughing.
- Travel suggestions: make sure you bring disinfectant wipes with you. Sanitize things your hands may come in contact with. Bring hand sanitizers with you. You may want to bring your own food and drink on the airplane. In hotels don’t forget to sanitize remote controls, light switches etc.
- Stay home if you are sick.
- If you are coughing, make sure you cough in your tissues. Make sure you sanitize surfaces that become contaminated, with disinfectant wipes. You can also use rubbing alcohol (New York Times, 2020)
- Clean frequently touched surfaces such as: table tops, counters, light switches, door knobs, remote controls, cell phones, with disinfectant wipes.
- In the event of being quarantined, stock up on items: hand sanitizer, Clorox, sanitizing wipes, prescription medications, and medications for cough and fever, a 30 day supply of food, canned goods, diapers, formula, toilet paper, paper towels, laundry detergent, and bottled water.
- Mask are not necessary unless you have the virus, or you are caring for someone that has the virus/is ill. The best ones are N95 mask, because they help to block 95% of the particles.

- If a person is sick with the coronavirus. They should be in a separate bedroom, and bathroom, should not care for pets. Do not share their towels or eating utensils(CDC, March 1, 2020).
- Prepare for the possibility of working from home, or children's schools closing.
- "Employees who have symptoms of acute respiratory illness are recommended to stay home and not come to work until they are free of fever (100.4 Degrees F [37.8 degrees C] or greater using an oral thermometer), signs of a fever, and any other symptoms for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever- reducing or other symptoms-altering medicines (e.g. cough suppressants). Employees should notify their supervisor and stay home if they are sick" (CDC, February, 2020)
